Volunteer employees aim to plant 445 trees honouring Canada Life's companies' years of operation

LONDON, September 19, 2019. . . Today, a single Red Maple tree – representing the first year that Great-West Life, London Life and Canada Life have operated under the new Canada Life brand – was planted at the downtown London office facing Queens Ave.

All the trees planted are native to London and will be provided with the assistance of ReForest London.

Canada Life has been the lead sponsor of ReForest London since 2009 and employees have planted 4,320 native trees and shrubs at various locations throughout the city during that time.
