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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 3, 2021

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended March 31, 2021 (the "period"), that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "CLIML" refers to Canada Life Investment Management Ltd., the manager of the Fund. CLIML is wholly owned by The Canada Life Assurance Company ("Canada Life"). CLIML has entered into a fund administration agreement with Mackenzie Financial Corporation ("Mackenzie"), an affiliate of CLIML and Canada Life, for administrative services (see *Recent Developments*). In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in companies located anywhere in the world that are involved in, or that benefit from, infrastructure-related operations.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors looking for a global equity fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock markets and who have a medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Q Series (formerly Quadrus Series) securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the period, the Fund's Q Series securities returned 13.2% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 37.3% for the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index. It also compares with a return of 20.2% for the Fund's new blended index, which is composed of an 80% weighting in the S&P Global Infrastructure Index (returned 22.1%) and a 20% weighting in the MSCI World Infrastructure (Net) Index (returned 12.4%). The new blended index better reflects the composition of the Fund. Effective January 1, 2021, it replaced the Fund's previous narrow index, the S&P Global Infrastructure Index. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis

in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Most global equity markets rebounded to all-time highs following the pandemic-driven collapse in March 2020. News of successful vaccine development helped lift stocks expected to benefit from the easing of lockdown restrictions. However, waves of COVID-19 infections and hospitalizations in the second half of the period slowed reopening in many regions. In response, governments continued to provide significant stimulus to boost struggling economies. Currency movements reduced returns in Canadian dollar terms.

Within the S&P Global Infrastructure Index, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and Italy were the strongest-performing countries in Canadian dollar terms, while the Netherlands, Germany and China were the weakest. The industrials and energy sectors were the strongest performers, while utilities was the weakest.

Within the MSCI World Infrastructure (Net) Index, Austria, Denmark and New Zealand were the strongest-performing countries in Canadian dollar terms, while Belgium, Switzerland and Singapore were the weakest. The health care and energy sectors were the strongest performers, while utilities and communication services were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its focus on infrastructure. The Fund's cash position also detracted from performance as markets rose. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of a blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed both the new blended index and the previous narrow index, with stock selection in the energy and industrials sectors detracting from performance. At a country level, overweight exposure to China detracted. Relative to the new blended index, stock selection and an underweight position in France also detracted from performance. Relative to the previous narrow index, stock selection and an underweight position in Mexico detracted.

Conversely, stock selection in the utilities sector contributed to performance relative to both the new blended index and the previous narrow index. Relative to the new blended index, an underweight position in communication services also contributed to performance, as did stock selection in the United Kingdom and United States. Relative to the previous narrow index, overweight exposure to the United Kingdom contributed.

Over the period, the Fund's exposure to the United States decreased, and exposure to the communication services sector increased, as a result of the quantitative processes employed by the portfolio management team.

Net Assets

The Fund's NAV declined by 40.1% to \$26.9 million at March 31, 2021, from \$45.0 million at March 31, 2020. This change was composed primarily of \$6.5 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, \$23.4 million in net redemptions, and \$1.1 million in cash distributions.

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See *Other Related Party Transactions* for the percentage of the Fund's NAV owned by related parties. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. CLIML manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors.

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for Q Series of 2.56% during the year ended March 31, 2021, was slightly higher than the MER of 2.55% for the year ended March 31, 2020. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The MER for D5 Series decreased due to a decrease in fund costs. The MER for H5 Series increased due to an increase in fund costs.

Recent Developments

Governments worldwide have enacted various measures in seeking to combat the spread of the COVID-19 virus. These measures have led to significant volatility in equity markets and material disruption to businesses globally, resulting in an economic slowdown.

Ongoing uncertainty regarding the duration and long-term impact of the pandemic and the implementation of vaccination programs, as well as the efficacy of government and central bank monetary and fiscal interventions, may continue to affect the Fund's performance in future periods.

The portfolio management team takes a quantitative approach to stock selection that uses systematic multi-factor analysis. Measures such as earnings growth, price-earnings ratio, free cash flow variability and industry sales trends are used in quantitative models that rank global infrastructure equities according to expected risk and returns. As such, the team does not generate market expectations and does not make investment decisions according to macroeconomic forecasts.

On August 14, 2020, the Fund was renamed Canada Life Global Infrastructure Equity Fund (London Capital).

Effective January 1, 2021, the Fund's manager and trustee changed from Mackenzie to CLIML following CLIML's receipt of regulatory approval to be registered as an investment fund manager. This change received a positive recommendation from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee ("IRC"). Mackenzie continues to provide certain administrative and transfer agency services to the Fund.

Concurrent with this change, Mackenzie replaced GLC Asset Management Group Ltd. as sub-advisor to the Fund.

Also effective January 1, 2021, the Mackenzie Funds' IRC was replaced by the Canada Life Funds' IRC, which consists of the following three members: Steve Geist (Chair), Joanne De Laurentiis and Linda Currie.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to CLIML or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie for the period from April 1 to December 31, 2020 ("the pre-manager change period"), and to CLIML thereafter at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. After the pre-manager change period, CLIML paid the administration fee to Mackenzie for providing day-to-day administration services, including financial reporting, communications to investors and securityholder reporting, maintaining the books and records of the Fund, NAV calculations, and processing orders for securities of the Fund. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by CLIML and segregated funds managed by Canada Life and its subsidiaries may invest in the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At March 31, 2021, funds managed by CLIML and segregated funds managed by Canada Life owned 54.0% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

At March 31, 2021, Canada Life had an investment of \$12,561 in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

Mackenzie relied on a recommendation issued by the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee to replace Mackenzie with CLIML as the Fund's manager and trustee in January 2021.

Past Performance

The Fund's past performance information is presented in the following charts and table. It assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The charts and table do not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. The past performance of the Fund is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

If you hold this Fund outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional securities of the Fund. The blended index is composed of 80% S&P Global Infrastructure Index and 20% MSCI World Infrastructure (Net) Index. In future reports, performance will be compared to this index.

The MSCI World (Net) Index represents large- and mid-cap equity performance across 23 developed markets. Net total returns are calculated after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The S&P Global Infrastructure Index provides liquid and tradable exposure to 75 companies from around the world that represent the listed infrastructure universe. To create diversified exposure across the global listed infrastructure market, the index has balanced weights across three distinct infrastructure clusters: utilities, transportation and energy.

The MSCI World Infrastructure (Net) Index represents the global opportunity set of companies that own or operate infrastructure assets. It includes large- and mid-cap equities across 23 developed markets. Net total returns are calculated after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie, in the pre-manager change period, in part to pay GLC Asset Management Group Ltd., an affiliate of Mackenzie, for investment advisory services, including managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio. Subsequent to the change in manager, the Fund's management fees were used by CLIML in part to pay Mackenzie for investment advisory services.

Quadrus Investment Services Ltd. ("Quadrus"), an affiliate of CLIML and Mackenzie, is the principal distributor for the Fund and is paid trailing commissions out of the management fees. In the pre-manager change period, Canada Life provided certain services to Mackenzie in connection with Mackenzie's portfolio management activities. Canada Life was responsible for paying certain administrative costs and all sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers whose clients invest in the Fund. As such, Quadrus and Canada Life received a portion of the management fees that the Fund paid to Mackenzie. Approximately 77% of the total management fees that Mackenzie received from the Canada Life Mutual Funds during the pre-manager change period was paid under these arrangements.

Subsequent to the change in manager, CLIML used the management fees to fund distribution-related payments to Quadrus and to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

Mackenzie and CLIML used approximately 38% of the total management fee revenues received from all Canada Life Mutual Funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 40% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the year. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to sales commissions related to gross sales of redemption charge securities of the Fund.

H Series and H5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee. Investors in H5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

HW Series and HW5 Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee. Investors in HW5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

L Series and L5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors in L5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

N Series and N5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$100,000, who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, and who have entered into an N type series account agreement with CLIML and Quadrus. Investors in N5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

QF Series and QF5 Series securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QF5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

QFW Series and QFW5 Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QFW5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series R securities are offered only to other funds managed by CLIML on a non-prospectus basis in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option, a low-load purchase option and a no-load purchase option. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to CLIML if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
