# CANADA LIFE GLOBAL GROWTH BALANCED FUND

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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the performance and outlook of Canada Life Global Growth Balanced Fund (the "Fund") in the six-month period ended September 30, 2023 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "CLIML" and "the Manager" refer to Canada Life Investment Management Ltd., which is wholly owned by The Canada Life Assurance Company ("Canada Life"). The Manager has entered into a fund administration agreement with Mackenzie Financial Corporation ("Mackenzie"), an affiliate of the Manager and Canada Life, for administrative services. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's A Series securities returned 1.1% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 1.0% for a blended index composed of a 60% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 2.9%), and a 40% weighting in the Bloomberg Multiverse (Hedged) Index (returned -1.9%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equities rose over the period as central banks slowed the pace of their interest rate increases. The global economy proved resilient, and employment remained strong. With high inflation persisting, the U.S. Federal Reserve, European Central Bank and Bank of England raised their policy rates, albeit at a slower pace. In response, global fixed income yields moved higher, while bond prices fell. Global corporate bond prices declined but outperformed government bonds, with credit spreads (the difference in yield between corporate and government bonds) narrowing.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Hungary, Egypt and Turkey were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Hong Kong, New Zealand and Finland were the weakest. The energy, information technology and communication services sectors were the strongest performers, while utilities, real estate and consumer staples were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income assets, which underperformed equities in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund performed in line with the blended index, with the equity and fixed income portfolios outperforming the equity and fixed income portions of the blended index.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the United States and Brazil contributed to performance. In sector terms, stock selection in financials and health care contributed to performance. Conversely, stock selection in China detracted from performance, as did an underweight position and stock selection in Japan. In sector terms, stock selection in communication services detracted from performance.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, a shorter duration (lower sensitivity to interest rates) in the United States and United Kingdom contributed to performance. Security selection among global government bonds and securitized bonds also contributed to performance. Conversely, underweight exposure to global investment grade corporate bonds detracted from performance as credit spreads narrowed.

Over the period, exposure to North America and emerging markets increased within the equity portfolio, while exposure to developed Asia Pacific and European markets decreased, as a result of portfolio activity and market developments. In the equity portfolio management team's opinion, market sentiment has improved, particularly with respect to large-capitalization companies with adaptable business models and high levels of data and processing power. The team expects higher interest rates, lower corporate earnings and a more challenging investment environment, in which the team believes the portfolio's holdings in high-quality companies with durable growth have the potential to outperform.

The fixed income portfolio management team believes corporate bonds offer compelling yield opportunities with global interest rates at multi-year highs. While the team believes mortgage-backed securities remain attractive as a higher-quality and liquid source of yield, these securities became more fairly valued as spreads narrowed.

### Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 6.4% during the period to \$22.4 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.4 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$1.9 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

### Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2023, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2023. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for F Series and F5 Series decreased due to a decrease in the management fee rates effective July 22, 2022, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

### Recent Developments

Subject to investor approval at a special meeting to be held on or about January 15, 2024, the Manager has proposed that effective on or about January 26, 2024, the Fund will be merged into Canada Life Global Strategic Income Fund.

### Related Party Transactions

#### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. The Manager paid the administration fees to Mackenzie for providing day-to-day administration services, including financial reporting, communications to investors and securityholder reporting, maintaining the books and records of the Fund,

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NAV calculations and processing orders for securities of the Fund. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

## Other Related Party Transactions

At September 30, 2023, Canada Life had an investment of \$0.01 million in the Fund (0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Canada Life Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.







## Past Performance







## Year-by-Year Returns

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio.

The Manager is responsible for paying certain administrative costs and all sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers whose clients invest in the Fund. As the principal distributor for the Fund, Quadrus Investment Services Ltd. ("Quadrus"), an affiliate of the Manager, is paid trailing commissions out of the management fees.

The Manager used approximately 37% of the total management fee revenues received from all Canada Life Mutual Funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to Quadrus and Quadrus-authorized dealers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 37% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

## Fund Formation and Series Information

The Fund may have undergone a number of changes, such as a reorganization or a change in manager, mandate or name. A history of the major changes affecting the Fund in the last 10 years can be found in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

Date of Formation: August 14, 2020

The Fund may issue an unlimited number of securities of each series. The number of issued and outstanding securities of each series is disclosed under *Financial Highlights*.

A Series and T5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors in T5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

F Series and F5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee. Investors in F5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

N Series and N5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500, who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, and who have entered into an N Series Account Agreement with CLIML and Quadrus. Investors in N5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

QF Series and QF5 Series securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QF5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

QFW Series and QFW5 Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$500 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QFW5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

W Series and W5 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors in W5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Effective September 16, 2022, FW Series and FW5 Series securities were redesignated as F Series and F5 Series securities respectively.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option,<sup>†</sup> a low-load purchase option<sup>†</sup> and a no-load purchase option. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to CLIML if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series. For further details on these purchase options, please refer to the Fund's Simplified Prospectus and Fund Facts.
