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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

July 13, 2020

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the year ended March 31, 2020 (the "period"), that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks income and preservation of capital by investing primarily in Canadian fixed income securities and asset-backed securities with maturities of more than one year. The Fund may hold up to 30% of its assets in foreign investments.

### Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for short- to medium-term investors looking for a Canadian fixed income fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of bond markets and who have a low tolerance for risk.

### Results of Operations

#### Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Quadrus Series securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the period, the Fund's Quadrus Series securities returned 3.0% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index return of 4.5%. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Government bond prices rose as yields declined over the period, while corporate bond prices fell. In March, the Bank of Canada made emergency policy rate cuts in response to the COVID-19 crisis, as did the U.S. Federal Reserve after three earlier reductions of the federal funds rate. Yields on 10-year and 30-year Government of Canada bonds fell to record lows, leading long-term government bonds to outperform. Corporate bonds, especially in the energy sector, underperformed as credit risks began to reflect economic concerns. High-yield bond prices fell significantly.

The Fund underperformed the index, with holdings in high-yield bonds and term loans detracting from performance. Conversely, duration positioning within federal and corporate bonds contributed to performance.

The Fund's foreign currency exposure was substantially hedged. Hedging detracted from absolute performance primarily as the U.S. dollar appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar.

Over the period, the portfolio management team increased the Fund's exposure to provincial bonds and foreign government bonds, and decreased its exposure to federal bonds, based on the relative valuations of these sectors. The team also increased the Fund's exposure to the United States based on valuations.

### Net Assets

The Fund's NAV increased by 195.2% to \$36.0 million at March 31, 2020, from \$12.2 million at March 31, 2019. This change was composed primarily of \$0.6 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and \$23.2 million in net sales.

See *Other Related Party Transactions* for the percentage of the Fund's NAV owned by related parties. As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At March 31, 2020, Mackenzie had received no such notices.

### Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for Quadrus Series of 1.65% during the year ended March 31, 2020, was higher than the annualized MER of 1.60% for the period ended March 31, 2019, due to an increase in fund costs. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

### Recent Developments

Governments worldwide have enacted emergency measures to combat the spread of the COVID-19 virus in the last several months. These measures have caused significant volatility and weakness in global equity markets and material disruption to businesses globally, resulting in an economic slowdown. Governments and central banks have reacted with significant monetary and fiscal interventions designed to stabilize economic conditions.

The duration and impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on businesses and markets, and the extent of economic relief measures provided by governments and central banks, are unknown at the reporting date and it is therefore not possible to reliably estimate the impact on the financial results and position of the Fund in future periods.

The portfolio management team believes there are opportunities in an environment of lower yields. Specifically, the team believes short-term bonds could outperform as market demand for long-term bonds may result

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in more valuation risk. With the re-pricing in corporate bond markets, the team believes the risk-reward outlook for corporate bonds is becoming more attractive, particularly for short-term bonds, and is therefore considering increasing exposure to selected high-quality, shorter-term corporate bonds. In the team's view, developed economies such as Canada and the United States will likely take time to recover from the massive consumption decrease stemming from the COVID-19 crisis. The team further believes many small and medium-sized businesses may never recover despite global monetary and fiscal measures, making security selection key.

On October 21, 2019, the Fund was renamed Canada Life Pathways Core Plus Bond Fund.

## Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

### Other Related Party Transactions

Series S securities are offered on a prospectus-exempt basis to London Life Insurance Company, The Great-West Life Assurance Company and The Canada Life Assurance Company (collectively, the "Related Insurance Companies"), all of which are companies affiliated with Mackenzie. The Related Insurance Companies were amalgamated into one company, The Canada Life Assurance Company, effective January 1, 2020. At March 31, 2020, The Canada Life Assurance Company owned 30.2% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

At March 31, 2020, The Canada Life Assurance Company also had an investment of \$8,500 in other series of the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.



## Past Performance

The Fund's past performance information is presented in the following charts and table. It assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. 








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## Annual Compound Returns

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio.

Quadrus Investment Services Ltd. ("Quadrus"), an affiliate of Mackenzie, is the principal distributor for the Fund and is paid trailing commissions out of the management fees. The Canada Life Assurance Company, which is also an affiliate of Mackenzie, provides certain services to Mackenzie in connection with Mackenzie's portfolio management activities. The Canada Life Assurance Company is responsible for paying certain administrative costs and all sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers whose clients invest in the Fund. As such, Quadrus and The Canada Life Assurance Company receive a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to Mackenzie. Approximately 78% of the total management fees that Mackenzie received from the Quadrus Group of Funds during the year was paid under these arrangements.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 31% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the year. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

H Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee.

HW Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee.

I Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$25,000, who are participating in the Canada Life Constellation Managed Portfolios program, and who have entered into an I Series Account Agreement with Mackenzie and Quadrus which specifies the fees applicable to this account.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option, a low-load purchase option and a no-load purchase option. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to Mackenzie if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
