Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 10, 2020

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended September 30, 2020 (the "period"), that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks long-term capital growth by investing mainly in Canadian equities. The Fund uses a value style of investing and may hold up to 30% of its assets in foreign investments.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors looking for a Canadian equity fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock markets and who have a medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

As with all new funds, in accordance with securities laws, performance can be discussed only when audited annual financial statements have been produced.

Net Assets

From its inception on May 25, 2020, to September 30, 2020, the Fund experienced \$7.9 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and \$174.5 million in net sales (which includes an inflow of \$180.0 million relating to fund merger activity).

As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors.

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for Q Series was 2.58% since inception.

Recent Developments

The duration and long-term impact of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic on businesses and markets, and the extent of additional economic relief measures which may be offered by some governments and central banks, are unknown at the reporting date. This uncertainty means it is impossible to reliably estimate the impact on the financial results and position of the Fund in future periods.

The portfolio management team remains focused on fundamentals. Valuation is still important, in the team's view, even if it is not recognized by the market in the short term. The team believes the Fund's holdings in the energy and financials sectors offer some of the most compelling value in the Canadian market.

At the end of the period, the Fund had overweight exposure to the financials sector – particularly to insurance companies, with a more modest overweight to banks – because the team thinks the outlook for both banks and life insurance companies is improving. Further, the team believes the life insurance industry offers very good value. In the team's opinion, life insurance companies are more diversified businesses, they are better capitalized than during the financial crisis of 2008–09, and the industry overall has a lower valuation both on a price-to-earnings and price-to-book basis.

Following the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee, Canadian Value Class (FGP) merged into the Fund on June 26, 2020. Mackenzie does not consider this merger to be a material change from the Fund's perspective.

Effective on or about January 1, 2021, the Fund's manager and trustee will change to Canada Life Investment Management Ltd. ("CLIML"), an affiliate of Mackenzie. This change received a positive recommendation from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee and is subject to regulatory approval for CLIML to be registered as an investment fund manager.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Mackenzie is wholly owned by IGM Financial Inc., which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corp. of Canada. Companies related to Power Corp. of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of Mackenzie. At September 30, 2020, the Fund held the following investment(s) in companies affiliated with Mackenzie: \$5.4 million invested in securities issued by Power Corp. of Canada. The investment(s) represented 2.9% of the Fund's NAV. In making the investment(s), Mackenzie relied on the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee. The Independent Review Committee issued the approval on the basis that the investment(s) would be made in compliance with Mackenzie's policies. Mackenzie's policies are designed to ensure that any related party transaction (i) is made free from any influence by an entity related to Mackenzie and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to Mackenzie; (ii) represents the business judgment of Mackenzie, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; and (iii) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie invest in the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2020, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 41.2% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

At September 30, 2020, The Canada Life Assurance Company, an affiliate of Mackenzie, had an investment of \$0.2 million in the Fund (0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

Mackenzie relied on an approval issued by the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee to proceed with the merger of Canadian Value Class (FGP) into the Fund in June 2020.

Past Performance

Past performance has not been shown for the Fund because the Fund has not reached its first fiscal year-end.

Financial Highlights

Financial highlights have not been shown for the Fund because the Fund has not reached its first fiscal year-end.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio.

Quadrus Investment Services Ltd. ("Quadrus"), an affiliate of Mackenzie, is the principal distributor for the Fund and is paid trailing commissions out of the management fees. The Canada Life Assurance Company, which is also an affiliate of Mackenzie, provides certain services to Mackenzie in connection with Mackenzie's portfolio management activities. The Canada Life Assurance Company is responsible for paying certain administrative costs and all sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers whose clients invest in the Fund. As such, Quadrus and The Canada Life Assurance Company receive a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to Mackenzie. Approximately 78% of the total management fees that Mackenzie received from the Canada Life Mutual Funds during the period was paid under these arrangements.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 44% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to sales commissions related to gross sales of redemption charge securities of the Fund. Because the Fund is in its first year, the percentage of management fees used to fund such distribution-related payments is not representative.

Q Series, D5 Series and D8 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors in D5 Series and D8 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

H Series, H5 Series and H8 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$500, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee. Investors in H5 Series and H8 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

HW Series, HW5 Series and HW8 Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee. Investors in HW5 Series and HW8 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

L Series, L5 Series and L8 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors in L5 Series and L8 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

N Series, N5 Series and N8 Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$100,000, who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, and who have entered into an N type series account agreement with Mackenzie and Quadrus. Investors in N5 Series and N8 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% and 8% per year, respectively.

QF Series and QF5 Series securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QF5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

QFW Series and QFW5 Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.25%, with their financial advisor. Investors in QFW5 Series securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 5% per year.

Series R securities are offered only to other affiliated funds and certain institutional investors in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option, a redemption charge purchase option, a low-load purchase option and a no-load purchase option. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. The charges under the redemption charge and low-load purchase options are paid to Mackenzie if an investor redeems securities of the Fund during specific periods. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
