## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 10, 2020

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the period ended September 30, 2020 (the "period"), that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

### Results of Operations

#### Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Q Series (formerly Quadrus Series) securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the period, the Fund's Q Series securities returned 7.8% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with the MSCI EAFE (Net) Index return of 13.7%. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Stocks in Europe, Australasia and the Far East ("EAFE") advanced over the period as improved economic activity and slowing COVID-19 infection rates in some regions globally prompted expectations of a recovery. Equity valuations were supported by low bond yields as most central banks kept interest rates low or reduced rates. Asian markets generally underperformed. Although many European countries outperformed, U.K. equities underperformed as the United Kingdom and the European Union continued trade negotiations.

Within the MSCI EAFE (Net) Index, Sweden, Ireland and Germany were the strongest-performing countries in Canadian dollar terms, while Spain, the United Kingdom and Portugal were the weakest. From a sector perspective, materials, information technology and industrials were the strongest performers, while energy, real estate and financials were the weakest.

The Fund underperformed the index, with stock selection in the communication services and health care sectors detracting from performance. The Fund's cash position also detracted as equity markets rose. At a country level, stock selection in Israel and Japan detracted from performance.

Conversely, stock selection in the industrials sector contributed to performance, as did underweight exposure to energy. At a country level, stock selection in the United Kingdom contributed, as did stock selection and an overweight position in Ireland.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

#### Net Assets

The Fund's NAV increased by 37.9% to \$14.0 million at September 30, 2020, from \$10.1 million at March 31, 2020. This change was composed primarily of \$1.0 million in net income (including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and \$2.9 million in net sales.

As a result of these investments, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At September 30, 2020, Mackenzie had received no such notices.

#### Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for Q Series of 2.47% during the period ended September 30, 2020, was slightly higher than the MER of 2.44% for the year ended March 31, 2020. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

#### Recent Developments

The duration and long-term impact of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic on businesses and markets, and the extent of additional economic relief measures which may be offered by some governments and central banks, are unknown at the reporting date. This uncertainty means it is impossible to reliably estimate the impact on the financial results and position of the Fund in future periods.

The portfolio management team aims to achieve a reasonable level of diversification at both the sector and the geographical level. Stocks are chosen through bottom-up analysis, based on the team's view of investment merit. Rather than focusing on a stock's historical level of volatility, the team considers the probability of permanent loss of capital to be the most relevant measure of risk. The team therefore seeks to protect against potential losses by understanding the risks posed by the valuation and financial and operational characteristics of each holding.

Effective on or about January 1, 2021, the Fund's manager and trustee will change to Canada Life Investment Management Ltd. ("CLIML"), an affiliate of Mackenzie. This change received a positive recommendation from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee and is subject to regulatory approval for CLIML to be registered as an investment fund manager.

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## Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

### Other Related Party Transactions

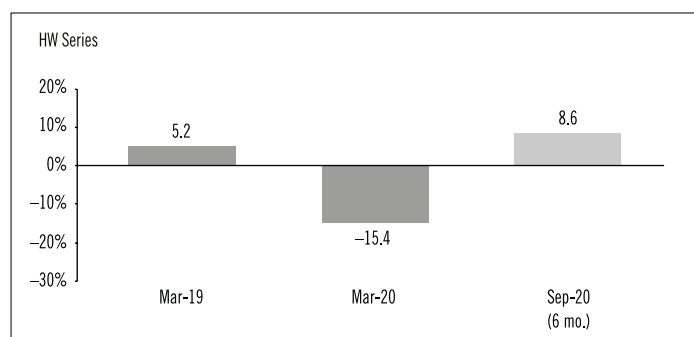
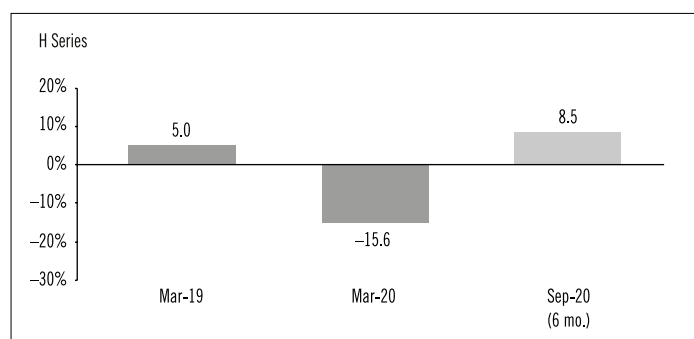
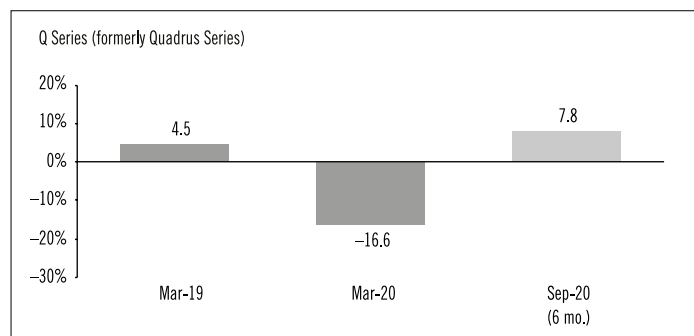
Mackenzie is wholly owned by IGM Financial Inc., which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corp. of Canada. Companies related to Power Corp. of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of Mackenzie. At September 30, 2020, the Fund held the following investment(s) in companies affiliated with Mackenzie: \$0.9 million invested in securities issued by Groupe Bruxelles Lambert SA. The investment(s) represented 6.4% of the Fund's NAV. In making the investment(s), Mackenzie relied on the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee. The Independent Review Committee issued the approval on the basis that the investment(s) would be made in compliance with Mackenzie's policies. Mackenzie's policies are designed to ensure that any related party transaction (i) is made free from any influence by an entity related to Mackenzie and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to Mackenzie; (ii) represents the business judgment of Mackenzie, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; and (iii) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie invest in the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. Segregated funds managed by The Canada Life Assurance Company, an affiliate of Mackenzie, also invest in the Fund on a prospectus-exempt basis. At September 30, 2020, funds managed by Mackenzie owned less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV, and segregated funds managed by The Canada Life Assurance Company owned 18.7% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day.

At September 30, 2020, The Canada Life Assurance Company had an investment of \$2.0 million in the Fund (14.1% of the Fund's NAV). If The Canada Life Assurance Company decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

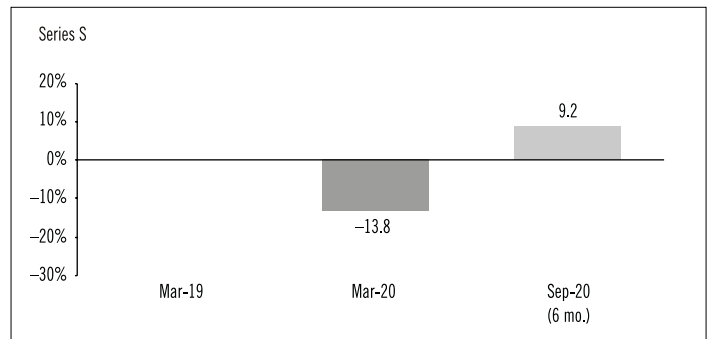

## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie in part to pay Setanta Asset Management Ltd., an affiliate of Mackenzie, for investment advisory services, including managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio.

Quadrus Investment Services Ltd. ("Quadrus"), an affiliate of Mackenzie, is the principal distributor for the Fund and is paid trailing commissions out of the management fees. The Canada Life Assurance Company, which is also an affiliate of Mackenzie, provides certain services to Mackenzie in connection with Mackenzie's portfolio management activities. The Canada Life Assurance Company is responsible for paying certain administrative costs and all sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively, "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers whose clients invest in the Fund. As such, Quadrus and The Canada Life Assurance Company receive a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to Mackenzie. Approximately 78% of the total management fees that Mackenzie received from the Canada Life Mutual Funds during the period was paid under these arrangements.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 39% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

HW Series securities are offered to high net worth investors investing a minimum of \$100,000 and who have eligible minimum total holdings of \$500,000, who are enrolled in a Quadrus-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program and who are subject to an asset-based fee.

I Series securities are offered to investors investing a minimum of \$25,000, who are participating in the Canada Life Constellation Managed Portfolios program, and who have entered into an I Series Account Agreement with Mackenzie and Quadrus which specifies the fees applicable to this account.
